PRIVACY NOTICE provided by Charles Cox Ltd

relating to

Leaseholders and Subtenants of Blocks of Flats

This privacy notice explains what personal data (information) we hold about you, how we collect it, how we use and how we may share information about you during our management of your development and after it ends. We are required to notify you of this information under the General Data Protection Regulation.

Please ensure you read this notice (sometimes referred to as a "privacy notice" and any other similar notice we may provide to you from time to time when we collect or process personal information about you. This privacy notice contains important information on who we are, how and why we collect, store, use and share personal information, your rights in relation to your personal information and on how to contact us and supervisory authorities in the event you have a complaint.

1. WHO WE ARE

Charles Cox Limited trading as Charles Cox Property Management collects, uses and is responsible for certain personal information about you. When we do so we are regulated under the <u>General Data</u> <u>Protection Regulation</u> which applies across the European Union (including in the United Kingdom) and we are responsible as 'controller' of that personal information for the purposes of those laws.

In this privacy notice, references to "we" or "us" means Charles Cox Limited

2. DATA PROTECTION PRINCIPLES

We will comply with the data protection principles when gathering and using personal information, as set out in our GDPR data protection policy.

3. THE PERSONAL INFORMATION WE COLLECT AND USE: INFORMATION COLLECTED BY US

In the course of our contractual obligations as set out in the lease and/or management agreement we collect the following personal information, which you or your solicitor provide us during the purchase:

- NAME, CONTACT DETAILS (ADDRESS, PROPERTY ADDRESS, HOME AND MOBILE TELEPHONE NUMBERS, E-MAIL ADDRESS, MORTGAGE DETAILS ETC)
- TITLE

The provision of the above data is required from you to enable us to perform our contract as managing agent appointed for and on behalf of the freeholder or freehold company. We will inform you at the point of collecting information from you, whether you are required to provide the information to us.

4. THE PERSONAL INFORMATION WE COLLECT AND USE: INFORMATION COLLECTED FROM OTHER SOURCES

We may also obtain personal information from other sources as follows:

• Information willingly provided from yourself

5. HOW WE USE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We will typically collect and use this information for the following purposes:

- For the performance of a contract you have with our client (the freeholder or freehold company) and pursuant to which we are appointed as their agent.
- For the purposes of our legitimate interests or those of a third party, but only if these are not overridden by your interests, rights or freedoms.

We seek to ensure that our information, collection and processing is always proportionate. We will notify you of any material changes to information we collect or the purposes for which we collect and process it.

6. WHO WE SHARE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION WITH

We routinely share the following categories of personal data:

• Those details listed under section 3

This personal information may be shared with the following categories of recipients:

- The freeholder or freehold company
- Shareholders of any freehold company
- Any approved consultants, contractors and subcontractors approved in line with our in house procedures and ARMA regulations.
- The providers of our accountancy software
- The providers of our IT support, including telephone support
- Your buildings appointed accountant, if one is place
- Other leaseholders from the same building/development
- HMRC, including Anti Money laundering
- Association of Residential Managing Agents (ARMA)
- First Tier Tribunal (Property Chamber) FTTPC
- Solicitors acting for the freeholder or freehold company
- Any insurance company or broker connected with your building/development

This data sharing enables us to perform our contract as managing agent.

We will share personal information with law enforcement or other authorities, if required, by applicable law.

We will not sell your personal information to any other third party.

7. WHERE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION MAY BE HELD

Information may be held at our offices and those of our group companies, and third party agencies, service providers, representatives and agents as described above.



We have security measures in place to seek to ensure that there is appropriate security for information we hold including those measures detailed in our companies GDPR data protection policy.

Or, for example, a set number of years after a data subject ceases to be a lessee in that development.

8. HOW LONG YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION WILL BE KEPT

• We will hold the details as set out in this notice for a maximum of 12 years

Reasons we can collect and use your personal information

We rely on a contractual obligation in the case of a leaseholder and legitimate interests in the case of a subtenant as the lawful basis on which we collect and use your personal data.

In the case of: legitimate interests we believe the interests are legitimate as we need the personal data of such individual to assist with fulfilling the contractual obligations between the leaseholder and freeholder or freehold company

9. YOUR RIGHTS

Under the <u>General Data Protection Regulations</u>, you have a number of important rights free of charge. In summary, those include rights to:

- fair processing of information and transparency over how we use your use personal information
- access to your personal information and to certain other supplementary information that this Privacy Notice is already designed to address
- require us to correct any mistakes in your information which we hold
- require the erasure of personal information concerning you in certain situations
- receive the personal information concerning you which you have provided to us, in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and have the right to transmit those data to a third party in certain situations
- object at any time to processing of personal information concerning you for direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means which produce legal effects concerning you or similarly significantly affect you
- object in certain other situations to our continued processing of your personal information
- otherwise restrict our processing of your personal information in certain circumstances
- claim compensation for damages caused by our breach of any data protection laws

We also have procedures in place to deal with any suspected data security breach. We will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected data security breach where we are legally required to do so.

11. HOW TO COMPLAIN

We hope that we can resolve any query or concern you raise about our use of your information.

The <u>General Data Protection Regulation</u> also gives you the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, in particular in the European Union (or European Economic Area) state where you work, normally live or where any alleged infringement of data protection laws occurred.
